

Michele Lake current chair of Church Council & treasurer of Cooinda ... she shares her story ...

My church story starts long before I was born; it started on Christmas day in 1944, when my father asked for Mum's hand in marriage. Dad being a Catholic, Mum a Methodist, not so welcoming in those days. Dad promised my Grandmother he would marry my mother in the church of her choice, and should they have children they would



be brought up in the church of my mother's choosing. I was born in Wynnum and grew up in the Wynnum/Manly district. I had one sister six years older than myself. By the time I was 10 years old we had moved homes five times, eventually, settling in a house in Manly.

My church life started when I was baptised in the Methodist Church at Wynnum as a young baby. My first Sunday School, aged 3, was at Wynnum West Methodist, then I attended the Wynnum Presbyterian Sunday School and Church with my mother (a special time). My claim to fame - at the church fete, I won a cooking competition aged 8 - cooking pikelets. Another move and I was off to Lindum Sunday School and afterwards into the car and off to Manly Methodist for church. I was fortunate to have a connection with every Methodist church in the district. Now all have been combined into Bayside Uniting. In my early teens I attended youth group at the Assembly of God Church at Wynnum West.

In my late teens I drifted away from the church, attending irregularly, wherever I was, buying a home and moving away from Wynnum/Manly. In my thirties, I spent a few years at the Wynnum Baptist church. So my life went on, I always had some understanding of Christianity, perhaps an immature understanding, however I believed God was always with me.

I was transferred to the Gold Coast in the late 80's and moved to Currumbin, and would attend church once again very irregularly. I became adept at sneaking in and out, hopefully not being noticed.

Eventually one Sunday, Rev Glennis caught up with me, and simply said, "You are always welcome here, and perhaps you would like to attend more regularly". Something to ponder???

As I headed towards retirement, my pondering became more in depth, and I finally started to attend church a little more frequently. When I

retired I knew what I wanted to do, or perhaps I was being called to do. When asked at work what I was going to do in retirement, I would simply say "look after my father and return to church life".

So my journey began in earnest, I attended an Emmaus weekend, and met a wonderful lady, Lorraine, whom I thank for her patience with me. I am still growing in Christ, and look forward to each day growing closer to Jesus.

I now look back and understand that those turning points in my life that I thought were my decisions were not really mine, but a path I was being led to follow. I am thankful and full of awe that the path has led me to this loving community and closer to Jesus. Blessings Michele Lake
