Develop your skills for reading the Bible, whether this be for the purpose of your personal study, preaching, leading, or giving an account of your faith at home or at work.



Last week Rev John Cox preached for our FAMILIES MINISTRY SUNDAY on the Mary and Martha story – where these women were given a choice. Prior to this passage in Luke 10, we are asked to choose between talking about discipleship, or about paying the price to become a disciple. In another, we must choose between interrupting our lives to love our neighbour, or to just walk on by (Good Samaritan). The life of faith is a life of choices. With our families ministry we have a choice to accept the responsibility of nurturing our young people and providing a safe place for them to meet with Christ.

The Royal Commission into Child Sexual Abuse shone light onto the Church in some very telling ways. It has "told" the community THE CHURCHES CAN'T BE TRUSTED! With good reason... over two thirds of the abuse that was recorded by the Royal Commission was perpetrated in Church institutions. While the Uniting Church in Australia represented only 1.2% of those recorded instances, we are still church, and we are still guilty of not protecting Children. So we (the whole church- even if we're not in youth/children leadership) need to learn and work towards a safe church for children and all people. We need to regain the trust of our wider community. We need to fully embrace and implement who we are 'a caring community with Christ' for our young people.

This Sunday our ministry team focus is DISCIPLESHIP. I wonder how you define this word? HINT: It has something to do with maturing in Christ.

So I will be asking the following questions....

- How do you tend to your spiritual growth?
- How intentional are you about belonging to a learning community that deepens your spiritual life?
- For whom do you provide spiritual encouragement?

Perhaps these questions are even a step ahead. Perhaps you've been coming to church for a short time or even for decades but have never committed your life to Christ. Maybe you've never been baptised and you're at the point where God is calling you into a deeper and more intentional relationship. If this is either the case, please contact me and we can talk further.


