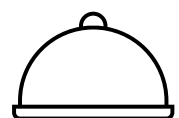
For \$30, you will enjoy a beautiful 2 course dinner and entertainment and have the opportunity to enter raffles and take part in an auction of quality prizes.

SAFE WATER FOR REMOTE COMMUNITIES (PNG)

"For almost 20 years the United Church in PNG has been providing water tanks, gravity fed systems and taps. But hardware wasn't enough, people's behaviour needs to change. The "Rait Mama" campaign in Milne Bay with women as change agents who encourage their family and community members to wash their hands, with food preparation and toilet use. Finally, we are seeing decreases in waterborne disease as a result of this project."
