Their ministry is a "wantok ministry" in the sense that they minister to their wantok Papua New Guineans in the strangest places, sometimes in their farms in the jungles or up in the mountains or beside a river. I am inspired by their ability to adapt to different languages and cultures, their perseverance and their passion to serve God and His people."
