For the next two months we will be looking at the book of Ephesians, a letter Paul wrote to believers whom he describes as a holy people.

This designation of holy doesn't come from the fact that we are good enough to be awarded the title of holy, but because we have Jesus who took our place and handed his holiness to us.

This is similar to Our Daily Bread readings on Thursday. Mike Wittmer reflects on the relationship we have with God; "By the Spirit we cry, "Abba, Father." (Romans 8:15).

Due to our adoption, we are called heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ (Romans 8:17). Mike encouraged us to talk to God, our loving parent, at any time for any reason.

We have received the Life and Witness Consultation Report from the team of Deborah Pinkerton, Rev Brad Foote and Rev John Hopping. Church Council wishes to thank you for your participation in this process, and we will be using this to assist us with the church profile as we move to call a new minister.

Your comments in certain areas will give us room to grow and improve but for the most part, the report has shown "green shoots", new initiatives that have taken place recently indicating our commitment to our 10-year vision to be known as a vital part of our community both spiritually and practically. These include our positive links into the local community through various activities such as Carpenter's Workshop, Leisuretime, and Coinda Place. Coinda has great potential to contribute more to the relational health, community engagement and financial sustainability of the congregation. New programs and activities like Dwell, the Autumn Fair, the Community Food Pantry and the primary school day camp led by the local chaplains are also very positive ministries for the future.
