The Mudgeeraba Uniting Church is hosting a **FAIR-TRADE MARKET ON SATURDAY 31ST AUGUST, 2024** from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm. The day before Fathers' Day.

The purpose of this market is to bring together stallholders who are committed to providing us with goods which have been manufactured so that the producers received a fair wage and worked in healthy conditions.

We hear much about the exploitation of workers, often school students trying to earn some dollars to make life more comfortable. If this happens in our own country where there are rules governing such mistreatment, imagine what it is like in society where no such rules exist.

On the day stallholders will be selling products from Asia, Africa, Central and Southern America as well as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people in Australia. Some of the products are from Palestine which benefit Christian, Jewish and Muslim communities.

As well as assisting to lift people above the poverty line, Fair Trade is a way of educating us about the difference Fair Trade purchases can make in the lives of people in distant communities.
